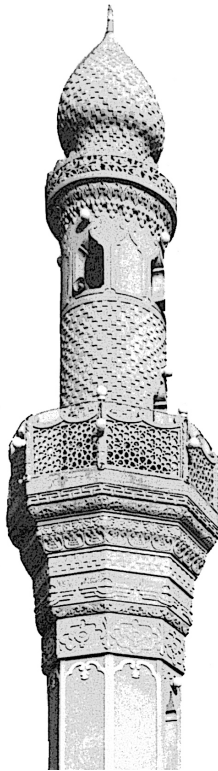

Iran: Nuclear Energy or Nuclear Nightmare?

The issue of nuclear testing by the Islamic Republic of Iran continues to increase tensions between Iran and much of the international community. Last week, delegates to a Vienna meeting of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) exchanged heated rhetoric, culminating in the statement of Iran's chief negotiator that, like the United States, Iran too could cause "harm and pain" if provoked.
