Global leaders and the people who run and inhabit developing countries are dreaming if they think that current efforts to uplift these nations are going to yield results without major changes in attitudes and techniques, says Dr. Senyo Adjibolosoo, an economic professor at Point Loma Nazarene University who has an intimate understanding of Africa because he was born and raised there.

And on Thursday, February 10th, friends and members of the San Diego World Affairs Council will learn what Dr. Adjibolosoo thinks these changes should be.

Professor Adjibolosoo feels current leaders seeking to improve living and governing standards in Africa are carrying out old-fashioned policies that don't work. One factor they ignore, he says, is the human factor, and he will expound on this in his talk: "*A Program of Action for Socioeconomic Development in Africa*"

Professor Adjibolosoo founded (in 1992) and is president of the International Institute for Human Factor Development, USA Inc., and sits on the Board of Directors for the Center for Justice and Reconciliation. He is the author of twelve books, most of them centering on the "Human Factor" and its importance in history and international development, particularly in Africa.

He has won scholarships and special study grants from Universities and other institutions in Canada, Ghana and the United States. In addition to earning his Education Specialist Degree at Point Loma Nazarene University, Professor Adjibolosoo received his Ph.D. from Simon Fraser University, his M.A. from York University and his B.A. from the University of Ghana.
