As a senior advisor to Prime Minister Tony Blair, Sir David has been a key figure in developing British foreign policy regarding the United States, particularly in the aftermath of September 11th and the decision to go to war in Iraq.

On Monday, December 6th, at the Westgate Hotel in downtown San Diego, Sir David will speak on the subject of "International Cooperation - Tackling Conflict: Lessons for the International Community from Iraq, Afghanistan, and Darfur."

Sir David Manning joined the British Diplomatic Service in 1972 and was subsequently posted to Warsaw, New Delhi, Paris, Moscow, Tel Aviv, and Brussels. In 1994, he was the British member of the ICTY Contact Group on Bosnia. Between 1995 and 1998 he was British Ambassador to Israel and in 2001 he was made Foreign Policy Advisor to Prime Minister Tony Blair. In August of 2003 he took up his current position as the British Ambassador to the United States.

Sir David, a graduate of Oriel College, Oxford, also studied at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies in Bologna, Italy. Sir David was made Knight Commander, Order of St. Michael and St. George in 2000.
